Our Work



August 2021 Earthquake

Answering the call to the Southern Peninsula

On August 14, 2021, a 7.2 magnitude earthquake struck the southern peninsula of Haiti. The epicenter was near Petit-Trou-de-Nippes, about 93 miles west of Port-au-Prince. Thousand of people lost their lives and many more were injured. Health centers, schools, churches, and homes suffered significant damage or were destroyed.

A small contingent from the Saint Rock Centre de Santé made several humanitarian visits to a number of communities affected by the earthquake including L'Asile, Baraderes, Bellevue, and Changeux. Staff were able to address acute medical needs as well as bring tarps, solar lights, food, and other supplies.

Along with many other relief organizations, SRHF was there to assist at a critical time to provide emergency services. The communities of the southern peninsula continue to recover and rebuild.



Expanding our Education Program

Increasing the number of schools sponsored by SRHF

In 2022, the education program paid 40 teacher and administrator salaries at three local primary schools. In addition, teachers at five accredited primary schools participated in professional development through a partnership with InnovEd and the Universite Quisqueya (InnovEd-UniQ). SRHF continues to monitor the impact of this program.

Approximately 560 children were able to attend school regardless of an ability to pay tuition. In the coming years, Saint Rock plans to continue adding schools to the sponsorship program. And plans were finalized to finish a new school building for the L'Institution Chretienne Grace Surabondante (ICGS).

Beyond primary school, the Flatley University Program has expanded to include vo-tech programs as well as traditional university degrees. More than 50% of students are female, offering a less traditional path for young women. In total, 65 young people were continuing their education after secondary school.

Macaco Health Center

Adding a second Centre de Santé

In 2020, the Macaco Health Center, 2.5 miles south of the Saint Rock Centre de Santé, was added as a temporary clinic space during the beginning of the COVID-19 pandemic. Through our partnership with Build Health International, SRHF has invested in the infrastructure by upgrading the electrical and communication systems. The clinical space has been transformed into a fully functioning health center. It is open five days a week with primary medical and dental services. We have plans to add comprehensive laboratory services

In June we received a grant from the Catholic Health Foundation to provide ultrasound technology and training with a focus on providing preventive and prenatal health care. Patients now have access to the first and only ultrasound machine in a region with a population of more than 9,000 people. We are expecting a significant increase in prenatal visits to the Macaco health center and an improvement in maternal health outcomes.



Cervical Cancer Screening

Harnessing the power of technology

In 2021, SRHF worked with Innovating Health International (IHI) to train clinical staff in VIA, or Visual Inspection with Acetic Acid. VIA is a simple and cost-effective method used for cervical cancer screening, especially in low-resource settings like Haiti where access to more advanced technologies like Pap smears or HPV tests may be limited. Due to its simplicity and affordability, VIA plays a crucial role in increasing the accessibility of cervical cancer screening, helping to reduce the burden of this preventable disease in underserved communities.

SRHF is leveraging mobile technology from Digicel's CommCare, a digital platform that offers a comprehensive solution for capturing cervical cancer screening data efficiently and accurately. CommCare's user-friendly mobile app can be deployed on smartphones or tablets, allowing healthcare workers to digitally record patient information, screening results, and relevant medical history in real time.



Celebrating 20 Years of Progress

2022 Gala highlights growth of SRHF

The annual gala drew more than 400 people to its 20th anniversary event in April of 2022. The event raised an unprecedented \$650,000 in support of SRHF's mission.

SRHF honored Brian Concannon, with the Dr. Stephen Bresnahan award.

Mr. Concannon, a Marshfield human rights lawyer, and founder of the Boston-based Institute for Justice and Democracy in Haiti shared that he gave up a corporate law job in Boston to work in Haiti for nearly a decade. "I felt called to put my energy and skills to work full-time for people who really needed it. I first went to Haiti as a UN volunteer in 1995. I expected to stay a year or two. I stayed for nine years," he said.

Dr. Stephen Bresnahan, for whom the award is named, was a Quincy native and Milton resident who cared for countless patients in Brockton and Saint Rock before he passed away in 2019. He started volunteering in Haiti in 2008 and often traveled to Saint Rock where he made many lasting connections.

Serving as honorary chair of the event was Dr. Alix Cantave, a Haitian-born Roslindale resident who works for the W.K. Kellogg Foundation overseeing programs in Haiti that support thriving families and equitable communities.

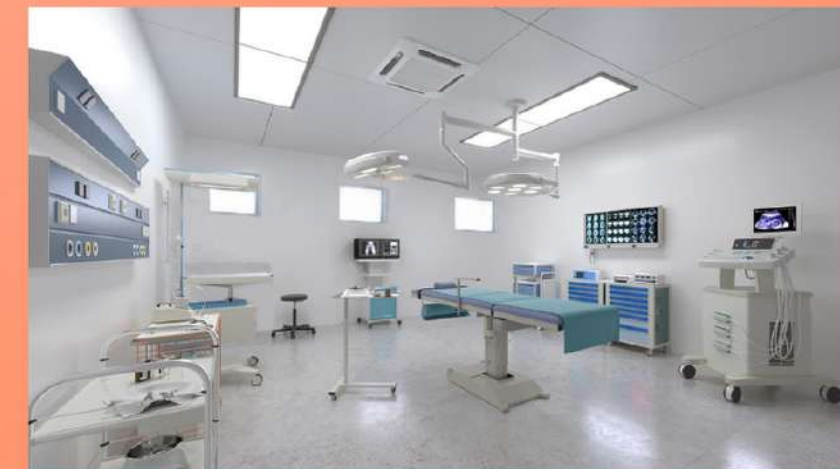

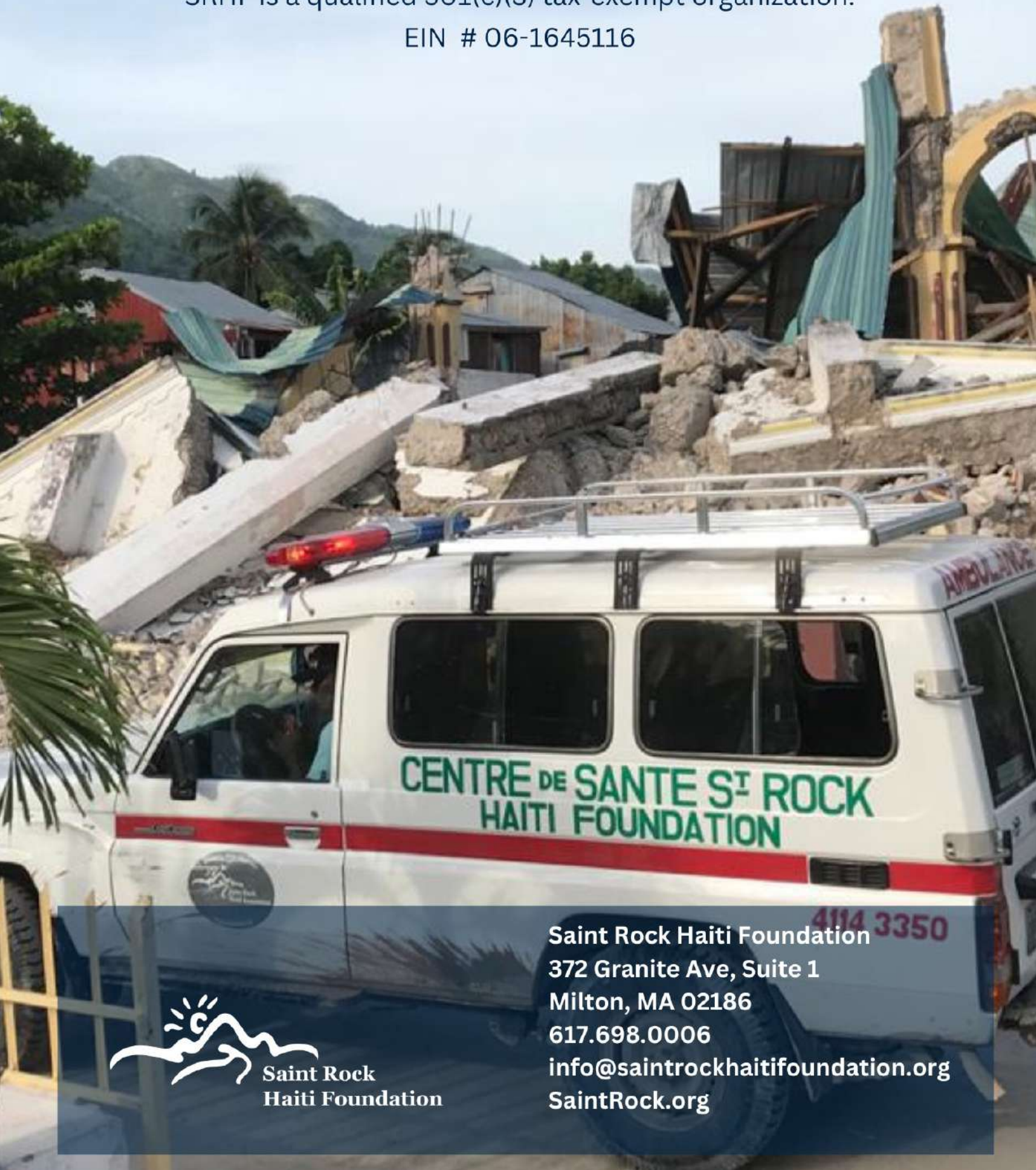
Our Future
